ALABAMA UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

The unemployment compensation program is financed by employer taxes Most employers pay federal and state unemployment taxes Employees do

not pay any unemployment compensation taxes on wages earned Unemployment tax is paid by employers on the first \$8,00000 of their workers' gross earnings during a tax year These are called insured wages
